Typical features and characteristics

## **Chestnut | Sweet Chestnut**

Veneer thickness 0,6 mm

#### **Description**

The chestnut is a tree that loves warmth and is therefore frequently found in regions where wine is also grown. It is most widely spread around the Mediterranean. To the north of the Alps the sweet chestnut grows only in temperate climate zones.

The annual rings are very distinctive, so that the texture of the wood is very strong. The structure patterns are impressive crown and striped figures. The yellowish brown to mid-brown coloured wood presents itself with a decorative characters, indeed with a richly varied play of colours. The pores are very distinct and have the same texture as oak.
